NEWS FROM AUSTRALIA

Note from a webinar hosted by 3M, 20 November 2020

Everyone has the right to get home safe to their loved ones- no exceptions!

This is the message of the Australia National Road Safety Week each year. Peter Frazer started up a national organisation, SARAH – Safer Australian Roads and Highways after his daughter was killed in a roadside crash on the 110km/h Hume Highway in 2012.

Her vehicle had broken down on a section with below standard width shoulders and she and a break-down truck driver were both killed by a passing truck.

Peter raised a petition to the State Government, lobbied for higher standards of road construction and maintenance and also focused on driver education. Each subsequent year during the National Road Safety Week drivers are encouraged to "take the pledge" to drive so that others survive.

WELCOME NEW MINISTER OF TRANSPORT

Trafinz welcomes the new Minister of Transport Michael Wood. Michael is the MP for Mt Roskill, Minister of Transport and Minister for Workplace Relations and Safety. He is also Deputy Leader of the House.

Michael was first elected to Parliament at the 2016 Mt Roskill by-election. In opposition he was Labour's spokesperson for Transport, Revenue, and Consumer Affairs and after the 2017 election was appointed as Parliamentary Under-Secretary to the Minister for Ethnic Communities and became Chair of the Finance and Expenditure Select Committee. He became Labour's Senior Whip in mid-2019.

As MP for New Zealand's most diverse electorate, Michael is closely connected to New Zealand's vibrant and growing ethnic communities and is focused on ensuring that every person regardless of background has the ability to flourish and reach their fullest potential in our country. He also has a particular interest in Auckland's urban development and is a keen supporter of more high-quality affordable housing, and rapid public transport.

Prior to becoming an MP he was on the Puketapapa local board so has a good understanding of transport issues at a local level. He and his family are regular users of public transport and he's not afraid to get around on a bike (including in a suit).

Michael is a strong supporter of present policy settings. On Labour's website he says: "I've gone through the GPS in great detail and I think it's a great piece of work that embeds the progress we've had in transport over the last three years"
